Rodney L. Dickens was named vice president - asset management and centralized services with Public Service Electric and Gas Company (PSE&G), in October 2006. In his new role he is responsible for ensuring the reliability of the utility's electric delivery assets, and overseeing various functions that support the provision of safe, reliable service. Mr. Dickens oversees the electric delivery capital and O&M spending plans, electric delivery planning, asset reliability, engineering and project management, strategic use of business systems, transmission business strategy, fleet operations, and supply chain support. Prior to his current position, he had been director - asset management.

A professional engineer, Mr. Dickens joined PSE&G in 1977 and has held positions in generation, engineering, project management, distribution field operations, and asset management. Before being named director - asset management he had served as division manager of PSE&G's Metropolitan electric division, with responsibility for directing all aspects of electric delivery operations for Essex and Passaic counties.

Mr. Dickens serves on the board of directors for the Children's Specialized Hospital in New Jersey. He is on the advisory boards for the Electric Power Research Institute's power delivery and markets council, and the National Electric Energy Testing Research and Applications Center. He also serves as the PSE&G representative on the Association of Edison Illuminating Companies' Committee On Power Apparatus.

Mr. Dickens holds a Bachelor of Science degree in electrical engineering from the New Jersey Institute of Technology and a Master of Business Administration degree from Rutgers Graduate School of Management.
